Her wide-ranging experience, perspective, and energy will be instrumental in leading The Aliveness Project to the next level of excellence in support of essential HIV/AIDS services to the over 3,000 member-clients living in Minnesota.”

Moser comes to The Aliveness Project from St. Paul Public Schools Community Education where she was a Community Programs Manager. Her previous work includes fund development, library management and HIV policy as the Planning and Policy Analyst for the MN Department of Human Services HIV/AIDS Division. Her early career in HIV prevention and care in Minnesota provides her with a deep understanding of both the health needs facing people experiencing chronic illness, and the political and financial landscape in which they exist.

"I'm extremely excited to be a part of The Aliveness Project. Aliveness has always been regarded as a vital and integral part of the Twin Cities' array of resources for individuals living and working with HIV/AIDS. I look forward to getting to know the members and working with Aliveness staff, board and vibrant network of community partners." Amy will begin employment with The Aliveness Project on April 4, 2016. Her hiring is the result of an exhaustive search by the Board of Directors after the resignation of long-time Executive Director Joe Larson in October.
